1033	<p>Democratic Period</p> <p>It was understood that the County Council Rights of Way would discuss the diversion of the path near to Yawlings at their meeting on the 10th July. The Village Trust had found the Dorset CPRE to be very helpful in this respect.</p> <p>A lady and gentleman asked about how they could go about a transfer of housing under the Section 106 arrangements. They had sadly had an infant bereavement which had left one of their children distressed to sleep in that room at night. The clerk would contact Cllr Robinson in the hope that something could be done to facilitate a transfer possibly to Charmouth.</p> <p>Mr Goodall provided an overview of the financial situation of the Community Shop. The shop had taken £2,500 in February, £3,500 in March; and £1,130 in April. With the requirement to repay part of the loan as well as interest in 2015 there was a greater challenge ahead.</p>
1034	<p>County and District Councillor's Reports</p> <p>There was little to report as most things had been discussed a few days earlier at the Annual Parish Meeting (APM) There was however a discussion regarding the list of problems that had been identified on the highway inspection which had been the focus of debate at the APM.</p>
1035	<p>Highways</p> <p>This item had been discussed within the County report</p>
1036	<p>Councillors' Report</p> <p>Rights of Way: A faulty handrail near the dungeon had been reported.</p> <p>Transport: It was resolved that Thorncombe Parish Council would take over responsibility for the operating of the Voluntary Car Scheme. Cllr J Higgs kindly offered to be the co-ordinator, for which he was thanked. There was some confusion over what sort of funding might be available to set up the scheme, which would need to be sorted. The clerk had forwarded councillors with a document explaining how these schemes worked.</p>
1037	<p>Finance</p> <p>The following accounts were agreed for payment: Creeds £723.00(1183), Easyspace Services £59.99(1184), Dorset Association of Parish & Town Councils £217.59, G&J Landscapes £204.00 (1186) and J Higgs £10.34 (1187).</p> <p>It was agreed that the grass cutting specification would now be deferred until the next season, however, the clerk was concerned that at present we have no hold on the total amount of expenditure and number of cuts.
