

	There were no Declaration of Interest made at this stage of the meeting.
037	Minutes
	The minutes of the meeting held on the 7 <sup>th</sup> July 2015 were adopted as a true record;

038	Matters Arising
	Cllr S Welford requested that the clerk formally writes to Jasmine Hill requesting her
	to be our School liaison. It was understood that the telegraph poles that had been
	installed were believed to be connected to the installation of Superfast Broadband.
039	Police Report and Neighbourhood Watch
	New signs had been erected at beauty spots warning of thefts from vehicles. The
	officer warned people to be careful about what they were saying on line because it
	could provide valuable information to thieves about when you will not be at home.
	The present Friday visit to the Community Shop was poorly attended by the public
	and he wondered when the best time would be. It was agreed that an article would
	appear in a future magazine asking views on this, however it should be understood
	that visits are subject to operational availability. There were concerns raised about
	parking on the pavement in Gribb View which he would look into.
039	Democratic Period
	A resident informed the meeting that they had experienced problems with a person
	who parks near her home. Further concerns expressed about people working on cars
	parked in the road in Gribb View. The police officer stated that there are no limits to
	the number of vehicles that owners can park on the highway, however, all vehicles
	on the highway must have valid insurance, have paid their car tax, and where
	applicable hold a valid MOT certificate. In addition the vehicle must be road worthy.
	It was felt that there could be a discussion with the committee of the village hall and
	the PCC regarding possible use of their car parks. A small working group, consisting
	of Cllr's D Marsh, S Dunford and J Higgs would investigate the issues and report
	back. A parishioner was concerned that road works were occurring without prior
	notification, or in some cases without the required traffic warning signs. The clerk
	stated that normal road works required advanced notification, but of course there are
	occasions when emergency work is required, which cannot give such notice. All road
	works should however conform to the Traffic Signs Regulations 2011. It was
	reported that a public footpath at Higher Hewood was obstructed and overgrown. It
	was also reported that a path at Forde Abbey was obstructed by Maze. Cllr Higgins
	would investigate, and if necessary the clerk would write a letter reminding the
	landowner of their duties.

	BUDGET DCC - As a summary, This showed that the council had overspent its
	budget last year (2014/15) by £3m and that an overspend of £4.5m is predicted for
	this year unless a_ction is taken in the remaining three quarters to address this.

	Dorset Waste Partnership - In March 2015, an action plan consisting of 37 urgent
	improvements identified by three reviews of the Dorset Waste Partnership (DWP)
	was approved by the DWP Joint Committee. Six months on, all but four of these
	actions have been completed or adopted as new, more rigorous business practices.
	More work remains to be done.
	The DWP set a servings tanget for \$1 12(m to achieve it herder for 2015/1)
	The DWP set a savings target for £1.136m to achieve its budget for 2015/16.
	Further work to identify savings has been carried out, which indicates that
	£435,000 of this is now considered as unachievable this year and is included in

	the potential overspend figure, above. Efforts are being made to explore other savings ideas to provide some mitigation.

	The Lengthsman had undertaken some work recently and the Speed Indicator Device (SID) would be picked up from Lyme Regis Town Council next week.
043	Councillors' Reports Village Hall: A new reporting system is in place Rights of Way: Some improvements have been promised to re-instate the path at the Mill which has been unusable for some considerable time. Transport: It is understood that the Chard/Axminster bus service is secure at the moment. There have been incidents of lack of capacity on a Thursday and it was agreed that a letter would be sent on this subject. The car service was receiving a steady flow of requests Gateway Scheme: Some provisional costings had been obtained. Cllr Welford stated
	that she needed to know the size. The cost is about £3,000. £1,500 for DCC, £250 from AONB and £100 from TPC. A working group consisting of Cllr Higgins, Cllr Sowerbutts and Cllr Welford would investigate this project further.

	<ul> <li>Website: Cllr Sowerbutts informed the meeting that the site was nearly ready to be launched. It would include the shop, school, clubs and societies and the Church and Chapel, as well as the items required by the parish council. The clerk would forward minutes to him to be placed on the site.</li> <li>Community Shop: The AGM had taken place on the 24<sup>th</sup> August. Paul Roberts had been elected chairman. Changes had been made to improve the sales register system. Some new members with sales experience had joined the committee. The committee were looking into possible ways of refinancing the burden of the loan repayment.</li> </ul>
044	Playing Field A meeting had been held on the 1 <sup>st</sup> September. 11 people had indicated that they would be willing to help in the playfield, with four people stating that they would be willing to serve on the committee. At the meeting people had asked if the zipline and see saw would be re-instated. Dorset Community Action had been approached and had indicated that they were willing to be involved with the project. No response had been received from Magna Housing due to the holiday period. Resolved that the works to the trees and bushes be undertaken at a cost of £390.
