	There were no apologies for absence received

589	Minutes				
	The minutes of the meeting held on the 4 <sup>th</sup> December 2018, having been previously				
	circulated, were adopted as a true record; and were signed by the chairman				
590	Matters Arising				
	It was reported that the problem with the water leak (minute 570) had now moved				
	down the road. The chairman was concerned that some members of the public had				
	commented that they felt that the council had passed over the provision of a				
	defibrillator for Holditch Hall. He explained that it was decided that it was better				
	for the Hall committee to deal with this directly. There would seem to be some				
	problems with the period of time that this equipment was being provided for. The				
	clerk would look into the situation in other parishes that had installed this				
	equipment.				
591	Democratic Period				
	A parishioner updated the meeting regarding the provision of a double decker bus				
	for the school run operated by First. Whilst some progress had been made with the				
	cutting back of trees there still remained a problem due to the lack of enforcement				
	officer time to deal with the remaining problem landowners. The bus driver had				
	been concerned over the recent icy weather conditions and questions were asked				

	regarding the actual gritting routes through the parish. Another parishioner stated that he would be very concerned at the operation of double decker buses through the parish as there had been a number of incidents of vehicles toppling over on unsteady verges in the past. It was understood that there had been a road traffic accident at Shearing's Cross. The belief was that speed had been a major factor in this incident. One answer might be to have the words 'slow' painted on the road in this area.
592	County and District Council Report
	It was reported that the senior officer team was now in place and that the constitution for the new Dorset Council had been agreed. Full details of the new officers can be seen on the regular updates being circulated to all councillors.
593	Police and Neighbourhood Watch The Thorncombe Sports and Social Club had been broken into and a suspicious white van had been seen in the area on a number of occasions. The local PCSO will be visiting the Community Shop on the last Friday in the month between 10.30 and 11.30am.
594	Highways and Rights of Way There had been a large number of vehicles from the Somerset area had employed to deal with potholes in the Holditch area recently. There would be a litter pick in the village in area. The provisional date is the 6 <sup>th</sup> April.
	The Lengthsman had undertaken a number of projects in the parish recently. There had been more incidents of fly tipping again In the parish.
	ROW: Two stiles had been replaced with gates which will make access easier. There are a number of rotten boards on bridges in the parish that will need attention.
