

167	<ul> <li>Democratic Period</li> <li>Concerns were expressed that footpath 55 and 56 which crosses the Forde Abbey</li> <li>Estate had not been reinstated within the legal time limit after the planting of crops.</li> <li>There were also questions regarding what progress was being made regarding the</li> <li>diversion of footpath 48 (Yawlings). Cllr D Turner agreed to look into both matters.</li> <li>A parishioner expressed his concerns about the withdrawal of public transport in</li> <li>rural areas that has an adverse effect on the elderly or those who are unable to drive</li> <li>for health reasons. He was informed that the Thursday bus service to Axminster had</li> <li>been retained for the time being.</li> </ul>
168	<b>County and District Council Report</b> Talks are ongoing in relation to the shaping of Dorset for the future which could come into being in two years' time. Dorset have been having talks with Wiltshire who are a new Unitary authority. It is likely that the number of councillors would be reduced from the present 330 to around 90, making significant savings. Our district councillor spoke about dog bins, stating that there were no funds to provide additional ones, however Cllr S Welford stated that the request was to relocate some of them and not to provide more of them. Talks are underway between Dorset and Wiltshire Fire authorities with a view to a possible merger. Stephen Hill, the new WDDC Strategic Director had spoken at the recent DAPTC meeting. Their next meeting will be on the 1 <sup>st</sup> September.

170	<b>Bus Services</b> Service 688 to Axminster will continue as it has a subsidy from Devon County Council. There is matched funding for service 14. There will be an article on bus services in the next edition of Beneath the Vale and funds will be raised for the bus services at the breakfast club.
171	Highways and Lengthsman A gully at Horseshoe Lane needs urgent attention and will be reported by Cllr M Stead. There had been no requests for the services of the parish lenghsman since the last meeting.

	ROW: Some attention needed to paths at Johnson's Wood and Sadborow. The diversion of the path at Westford is still being looked into. Amenities: The Council agreed that it would have no objection to the sighting of the new Broadband cabinet by the bus shelter Playing Field: The small children's slide had been repaired and the association was awaiting the annual ROSPA report. Concerns that animals were to be kept in a field next to the pay area Car Service: The service continues to be well used, however whilst drivers have passes to park in hospital car parks in Dorset they do not at present have the same arrangement for Somerset Community Shop: Cllr Welford is looking into the feasibility of having solar panels on the shop roof. The clerk explained that at present a town or parish council does not have the authority to sell power to the National Grid
