| 570 | Matters Arising The water leak at Hoditch has now been dealt with. Wessex Water having at last accepted responsibility and dealt with it. Cllr Marsh stated that a parishioner had raised concerns about a tree near to the church car park. He had raised this issue with the PCC. The tree has a Tree Preservation Order on it. The tree had been inspected within the last 18 months and no issues had been raised. | | |

572 **Democratic Period** The chairman of the Community shop wished to thank Cllr Marsh for his work on securing funding through BVLAP for the coffee machine in the shop. Mrs Marsh updated the meeting regarding the school bus service. A directive had been issued stating that the young people must not sit on the floor of the bus. A further survey had been undertaken to identify how many trees still needed attention before a double decker bus can be introduced to the route. A parishioner stated that when he had sold the shop he had stipulated that the access to the right of the shop remained as a private access for the users of the flat; and that no commercial access was provided. The chairman responded by stating that that was not what the deeds stated; and that he would explain the situation when that item was dealt with later in the agenda. A member of the public stated that he felt that the amount allocated in the proposed budget for 2019/20 for grants was very low at £400. The chairman responded by stating that the council had done this to ensure that the precept did not need to be heavily increased. A note would be placed in the magazine informing organisations that they could apply for funding. The gentleman was also concerned that organisations were not made aware of the availability of grants from the Council. 573 **County and District Reports** No reports had been received 574 **Budget and Precept Demand** Proposed by Cllr J Higgs, seconded by Cllr N Higgins, that the budget for 2019/20 be set at £21,554 and that the Precept Demand be £10,100. All members were in favour. 575 **Finance Regulations** Resolved to adopt the revised Finance Regulations 576 **On-Line Banking** Resolved to accept the recommendations of the Finance & General Purposes Committee to adopt on-line banking. 577 **Community Shop Rights of Way** The chairman, having consulted the deeds document, confirmed that there was a right of way passage on foot only for access to the garage/store. It was further understood that there had also been another entrance which it would seem had been blocked off some years ago. Mr Whalley wished it to be made clear that he had not tried to stop members of the shop from using the access area when bringing out rubbish, but had only objected to the post box being blocked by the rubbish. 578 Highways, Parish Lengthsman and ROW Issues There are a number of road works scheduled for 2019. These include water mains repairs and road surfacing. Batham's Pit needs attention as the area is very muddy and the drains are blocked
